ONE-DESIGN CHAMPIONSHIP REGATTA

August 2-3, 2014

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Organizing Authority: Berkeley Yacht Club
Berkeley, California

1 RULES

1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing for 2013-2016 including US Sailing Prescriptions (RRS).

1.2 RRS 40 is deleted and replaced with “Competitors shall wear life jackets or other adequate personal buoyancy while racing. Personal flotation may be removed briefly while shifting clothing/gear.” Note that Code Flag Y will not be displayed.

1.3 For the Open 5.70 class, Appendix T Section A (PENALTIES WHILE RACING) shall apply. The first two sentences of rule 44.1 are changed to: “A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 while racing. However, when she may have broken a rule of Part 2 while in the *zone* around a *mark* other than a starting *mark*, her penalty shall be a Two-Turns Penalty.”

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the BYC clubhouse.

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1900 on the day before it will take effect.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the main flagpole located at the BYC clubhouse.

4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, ‘1 minute’ is replaced with ‘not less than 60 minutes’ in race signal AP.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.1 Saturday August 2 – 4 races are scheduled, with first warning signal at 11:30

Sunday August 3 – 3 races are scheduled, with first warning signal at 11:30

5.2 After the first race each day, the warning signal for each succeeding race will be made as soon as practicable. To alert boats that another race will begin soon, a series of short sound signals and a radio announcement on VHF 78 may be made. No race will be started after 1500 on Sunday August 3rd.

6 CLASS FLAG The class flag for each class will be as follows:

- J/24 Class flag – J/24
- Code flag “U” – Olson 25
- Code flag “V” – Open 5.70
- Code flag “W” – Catalina 38

7 RACING AREA The racing area for all starts will be in the vicinity Berkeley Olympic Circle “XOC”

8 THE COURSES

8.1 Attachment A shows the courses, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

8.2 Mark G is a gate. If one of the leeward gate marks is missing, boats shall round the one existing leeward mark to port.

8.3 There may be an Offset Mark “O” set a short distance from the weather mark. If present, the offset mark is to be passed in sequence as designated in the course descriptions on Attachment A.

8.4 The course to be sailed will be designated by flags displayed from the race committee signal boat.

9 MARKS

All Marks will be as described in the sailing instructions, except that new marks, as provided in instruction 11, will be yellow inflatable buoys.

10 THE START

10.1 Races will be started by using RRS 26.

10.2 The starting line will be between an orange flag on the race committee boat and a yellow mark.

11 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

12 THE FINISH

The finish line for courses 1, 2 3, 6, 7, and 8 will be between an orange flag on a race committee mark boat and a orange inflatable mark. The finish line for courses 4 and 5 will be between an orange flag on the BYC race deck and an orange stripe on the 5 MPH sign post on the opposite side of the marina entrance.

13 TIME LIMITS

Boats failing to finish within 15 minutes after the first boat in the fleet sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.

14 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

14.1 Protest forms will be available at the Regatta Table in the club house. Protests shall be delivered to the race committee representative at the Regatta Table within the protest time limit, which shall be one

hour after the race committee signal boat returns to the dock. The time will be posted on the official notice board.

14.2 Notices will be posted on the Official Notice Board within 30 minutes of the conclusion of the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings to which they are parties, along with the time and location of the hearing. Such notice shall serve as notification per RRS 63.1 and 61.1(b).

14.3 Requests to reopen a hearing held on August 3rd shall be delivered to the race committee representative at the regatta table within 30 minutes of a party receiving the hearing results in writing. This changes RRS 66.

15 SCORING

15.1 One race must be completed to constitute a series.

15.2 Boats will be scored by the low point scoring system found in Appendix A with no races excluded.

16 SAFETY REGULATIONS

16.1 Check-in and check-out: Boats are requested to check in with the race committee by sailing by the committee boat, on starboard tack, prior to the first warning signal. Boats leaving the racing area prior to the conclusion of racing are requested to notify the race committee, by VHF 78 if possible.

16.2 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible. The race committee will monitor VHF 78.

17 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS Boats shall not be hauled out during the regatta, unless the PRO has approved a written request for haul-out.

18 RADIO COMMUNICATION

18.1 A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

18.2 The Race Committee may use VHF channel 78 to communicate information about course selection and the sail numbers of boats that are OCS or have violated RRS 30. Neither failure of the race committee to communicate the sail numbers of recalled boats in a timely manner, nor failure of a recalled boat to receive or hear transmitted information, will be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1.

19 PRIZES

19.1 Prizes will be awarded after the racing, on Sunday, August 3rd, at the BYC clubhouse.

19.2 Unclaimed prizes will be held at the Race Committee Office for a period of one month only.

20 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

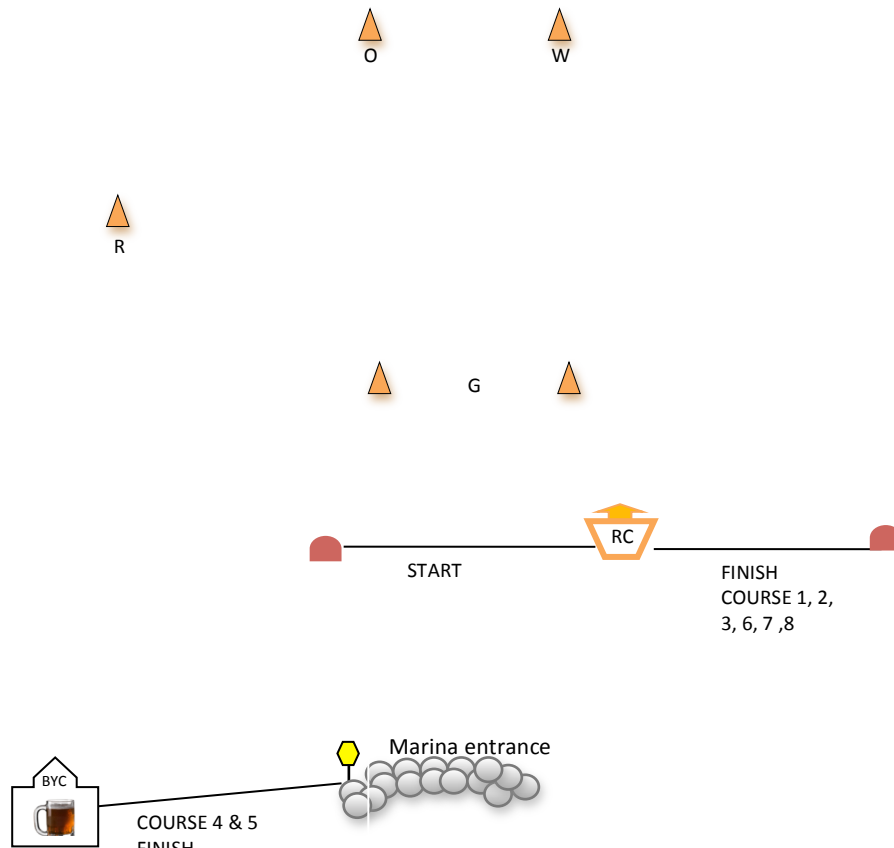

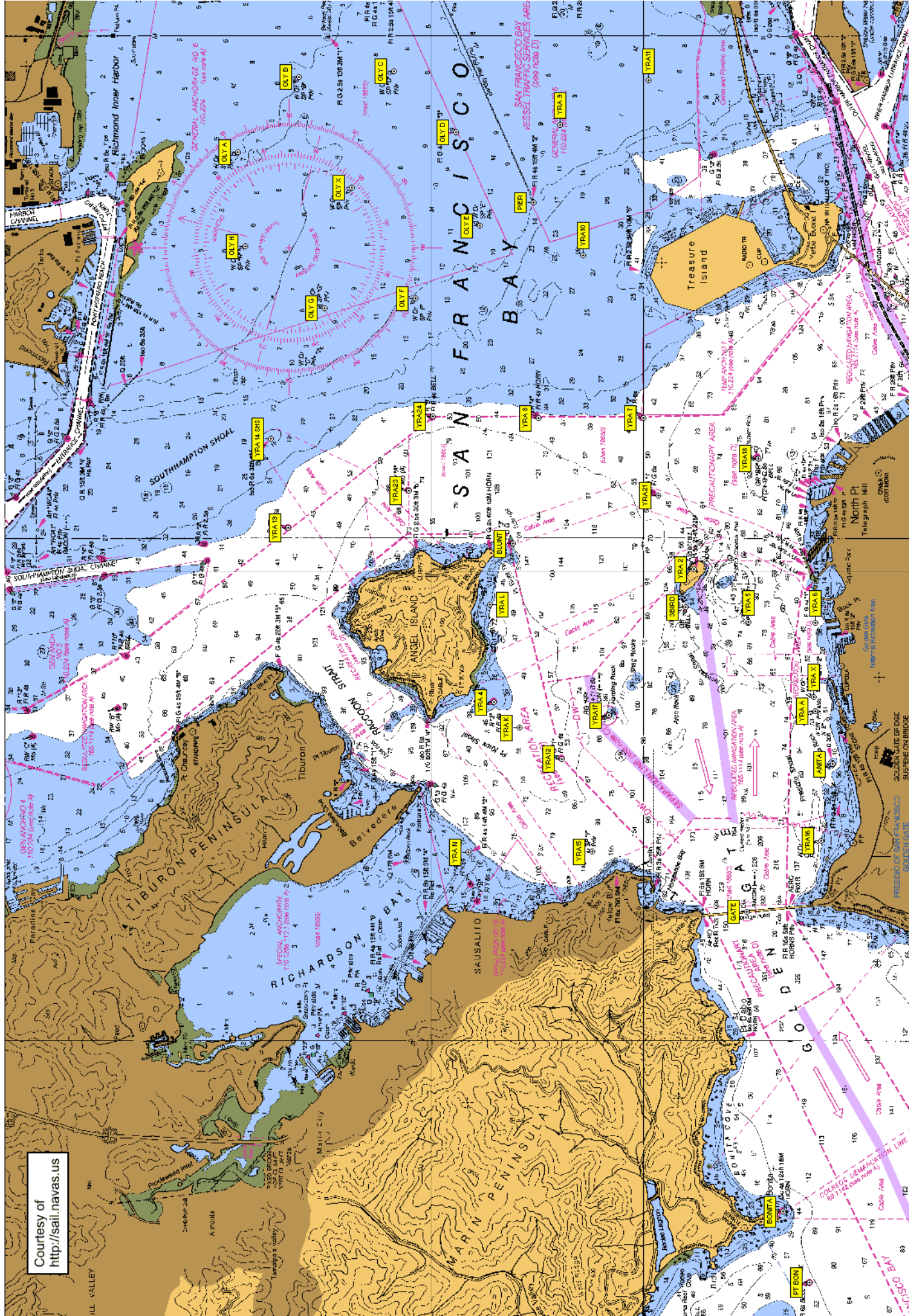

Course	
1	S-W-O-Finish
2	S-W-O-G-W-O-Finish
3	S-W-O-R-G-W-O-Finish
4	S-W-O-G-W-O-BYC Finish
5	S-W-O-BYC Finish
6	S-17-18-G-W-O-Finish
7	S-19-G-W-O-Finish
8	S-24-G-W-O-Finish
9	S-8-G-W-O-Finish

1. Marks W, O, R, 8, 17, 18, 19, and 24 will be port roundings. Marks G will be leeward gate roundings.
2. Marks W, O, R, G are orange.
3. New Marks, as provided in instruction 11 will be yellow.
4. In courses 1, 2 3, 6, 7, and 8 the finishing line will be with the Race Committee boat to starboard and the buoy at the port-end.
5. For courses 4 and 5 the finishing line will be between an orange flag on the BYC race deck and an orange stripe on the 5 MPH sign post on the opposite side of the marina entrance.
6. Mark 8 is R “4” Fl 4s Horn, approx 1 nm East of Point Blunt.
 Mark 17 is RG “HR” Fl (2+1) R6s Harding Rock
 Mark 18 is RG “BR” Fl (2+1)G6s Bell, Blossom Rock
 Mark 19 is R “8” Fl R2.5s, approx 1.5nm E of Pt Bluff;
 Mark 24 is R “6” Fl R 4s Bell, approx 1.1 nm East of Quarry Pt;
